

WHAT RESEARCH SHOWS:

- MORE EDUCATION IS USUALLY BETTER.
- MAJORS MATTER MORE NOW THAN PREVIOUSLY, BUT DO NOT CONTROL CAREER CHOICE.
- LESS EDUCATION MAY BE WORTH MORE EARNINGS DEPENDING ON THE CAREER CHOICE.
- GENERALLY, STEM CAREERS WILL EARN MORE OVER THEIR LIFETIME THAN HUMANITIES CAREERS.


